



066 Everything in its place

Pick out and recognise everyday objects that belong in these three spaces: kitchen, bathroom and doctor's surgery

Introducing the session

You can begin the session by doing a bit of brainstorming with the children, getting them to name objects that they might find in the kitchen, in the bathroom or in the doctor's surgery. Then you can show them the objects in the different Miniland sets so they can sort them and say which ones belong in which space. For example, if you pick out a cup or a spoon they would have to say that these objects can be found in the kitchen. You can ask them to name the object and explain or do the actions for how each one is used. For example, if you show them a hairbrush they can do the actions or explain that it's used to brush hair. Let them play with the objects (symbolic play session).

Game with Miniland products

There are five printable teaching worksheets that go with the different Miniland sets: 2 bathroom worksheets, 2 kitchen worksheets and 1 doctor's surgery worksheet.

On each worksheet you'll find the outlines of the Miniland set of accessories plus two "intruders". "In the bathroom, there are two objects that shouldn't be here, this isn't their space". The children have to mark the "intruder" accessories with an X and circle the correct ones. Before you begin, ask them to place the real objects on top of each outline and say their names. All the objects have their names in English written underneath to practice vocabulary.



Digital game

Playing digital games is a very visual way for children to learn how to associate everyday objects with the spaces where they belong (kitchen, bathroom or doctor's surgery). The game consists of dragging the objects shown at the bottom of the screen and placing them on top of their respective outlines. If they manage to complete all three spaces correctly, the game will become more complex, as this time the objects will appear jumbled up and the children will have to classify them according to whether they belong in the kitchen, the bathroom or the doctor's surgery.
